Ground-Water Withdrawal of 0.58 MGD for Public Water Supply, Pike Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania

REVIEW AUTHORITY

This application was reviewed by Commission staff pursuant to Article 3, Section 3.10 of the Susquehanna River Basin Compact, P.L. 91-575, and Commission Regulation 803.62 relating to ground-water withdrawals. The application was received by the Commission on May 7, 1991.

DESCRIPTION

<u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this application is to permit the withdrawal of water for distribution in a public water supply system.

Location. The project is located in Pike Township, Clearfield County, Pennsylvania.

Project Features. The applicant has requested approval for the withdrawal of 0.58 million gallons per day (MGD) from its Well No. 1 (Montgomery). The applicant plans to use the well to supplement supplies from its existing Montgomery Run Reservoir. The well was drilled in November 1990 and is 250 feet deep.

FINDINGS

The project is subject to SRBC ground-water approval and reporting requirements as per Commission Regulation 803.62.

The project is subject to SRBC water conservation requirements as per Commission Regulation 803.63(a).

No adverse impacts on other area ground-water withdrawals are anticipated. The project does not conflict with nor adversely affect the Comprehensive Plan, is physically feasible, and does not adversely influence the present or future use and development of the water resources of the basin.

DECISION

The application is approved pursuant to Article 3, Section 3.10 of the Compact subject to the following conditions:

a. The applicant shall comply with SRBC ground-water reporting and conservation requirements as per Commission Regulations 803.62 and 803.63(a), respectively. The required reporting data shall be submitted to the SRBC annually.

b. This action does not obviate the need for the applicant to obtain any other federal, state, or local approvals required for the project.

c. The Commission reserves the right, based upon new findings, to reopen any project docket and make additional orders that may be necessary to mitigate or avoid adverse impacts or otherwise to protect the public health, safety, or welfare. Commission approval confers no property rights upon project sponsors.
