Dear Mr. Rafferty:

The Susquehanna River Basin Commission (Commission) received a Request for Reissuance of Approval (Commission Form #86) on January 22, 2018, for Commission Docket Nos. 20120302, 20120604, and 20120604.1. Commission Form #86 indicated that effective January 1, 2018, Aqua-PVR Water Services, LLC had changed its name to Aqua-ETC Water Solutions, LLC (Aqua-ETC). Upon review of the projects and the submitted request for reissuance, it was determined that the request is in compliance with the regulations and consistent with Commission Regulation 18 CFR § 806.6(c). Therefore, the approvals listed above are hereby reissued effective April 24, 2018.

Copies of the above-referenced approvals are available on the Commission's Water Application and Approval Viewer (WAAV) at mdw.srbc.net/waav.

Please note that Aqua-ETC may operate under the terms and conditions of the reissued approvals not inconsistent with the conditions of the reissuance, provided that:

1. Within 120 days from approval of this reissuance request, Aqua-ETC shall post updated signage that meets Commission specifications and displays required project description information. Signage specifications can be found at the Commission's website (www.srbc.net), under "Forms & Applications," along with example sign templates for reference. The signage shall be maintained for the duration of the approvals. Such signs shall be posted at the point of entry or access to the project facility from a public right-of-way. If there is any restriction to access at such point that would prevent an interested person from legibly viewing such sign, then Aqua-ETC shall post the sign at the nearest location to such point, along the route of ingress and egress to same, where an interested person would have unrestricted access

- to legibly view such sign. Aqua-ETC shall submit photographs as proof of installation of the updated signage.
2. In accordance with the Commission's Regulatory Program Fee Schedule, these projects continue to be subject to the Annual Compliance and Monitoring fee (ACMF). The ACMF is contained in the Regulatory Program Fee Schedule adopted annually by the Commission. The ACMF will be invoiced separately and may be modified over the term of the reissued approvals.

Please be advised that this reissuance is contingent upon compliance with all provisions of the Susquehanna River Basin Compact (Compact), as well as the Commission's rules, regulations, approvals, conditions of approval, and any other requirements of the Commission. It is your obligation to fulfill all conditions of this approval within the specified time limits and provide written notification to the Commission, as appropriate, and comply with all conditions set forth therein. Failure to meet any term or condition within the specified time may subject you to enforcement action and imposition of civil penalties pursuant to Commission Regulation 18 CFR Section 808, Subpart B, § 808.15, and Section 15.17 of the Compact. Penalties range from \$50 to \$1,000 per day, per condition (which includes exceeding approved quantities), with every day being a separate offense.

Pursuant to Commission Regulation 18 CFR § 808.2 relating to administrative appeals, an appeal to this action must be made to the Commission within 30 days of receipt of this notice. All appeals must be made in writing on the Commission's Notice of Appeal form and conform to the requirements of Commission Regulation 18 CFR § 808.2. Pursuant to Commission Regulation 18 CFR § 808.2(i), an appeal made under this section stays the commencement of the 90-day appeal period contained in Section 3.10(6) of the Compact.

Source Approval

Section 1. Approval

After review of the record, including the technical findings of Susquehanna River Basin Commission (Commission) staff, the Commission determines that no adverse impacts are anticipated by the operation of this project, and that the project is physically feasible, does not conflict with or adversely affect the Commission's Comprehensive Plan, and does not adversely influence the present or future use and development of the water resources of the basin. Accordingly, the Commission hereby approves the modification to the existing approval as described herein in accordance with the conditions set forth below.

This approval is a modification of Commission Docket No. 20120604 that was approved June 7, 2012. The project sponsor has requested an expansion to the approved service area and a modification to Special Condition 16 to provide an administrative application process for future requests to expand the service area.

Commission staff has coordinated with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP), Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR), and the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) during review of this project.

Section 2. Project Information

Information concerning the project sponsor, water use type, and location are set forth in the table below.

Section 4. Standard Conditions

1. The project sponsor shall comply with all Commission regulations, including metering and reporting requirements contained in Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.30. This project is subject to the annual compliance and monitoring fee as specified in the Commission’s Regulatory Program Fee Schedule, which may be modified from time to time.

2. The project sponsor shall adhere to the metering plan reviewed and approved by Commission staff. Any modifications proposed for the metering plan shall be submitted for review and approval by Commission staff in accordance with Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.30. Modifications shall not be made until the project sponsor receives written approval of the amended plan.

3. Prior to the receipt of water from any source authorized pursuant to this approval, the project sponsor shall install and maintain metering on such source in accordance with Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.30. The project sponsor shall notify the Commission, in writing, and submit digital photographs of each meter when it has been installed, provide the serial number of the meter, and certify the accuracy of the measuring device to within five (5) percent of actual flow.

4. The project sponsor or any other person representing the project sponsor shall allow authorized employees or agents of the Commission, without advance notice, at any reasonable time and upon presentation of appropriate credentials, and without delay, to have access to and to inspect all areas where the project is being constructed, operated, or maintained, or otherwise exercise all investigative powers authorized under Commission Regulation 18 CFR §808.12.

5. The project sponsor shall keep daily records of all inputs to and withdrawals from the regional pipeline system, and shall report the data to the Commission as required. Any alternative measuring, monitoring, or accounting procedure requested by the project sponsor shall be submitted for review and, if appropriate, approved by Commission staff prior to implementing or modifying existing equipment or procedures.

6. The project sponsor shall maintain the meters and other measuring devices, accurate to within five (5) percent, so as to provide an accurate record of inputs and withdrawals, and certify to the Commission once every five (5) years, or as otherwise requested, the accuracy of all measuring devices and methods to within five (5) percent of actual flow.

7. The project sponsor shall comply with the water conservation requirements specified in Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.25(b).

8. If the project sponsor fails to comply with the provisions of the Susquehanna River Basin Compact or any rule, regulation, or order of the Commission, or any term or condition of this docket, the project is subject to enforcement actions pursuant to Commission Regulation 18 CFR §808.

9. Commission approval shall not be construed to exempt the project sponsor from obtaining all necessary permits and/or approvals required for the project from other federal, state, or local government agencies having jurisdiction over the project. All such permits and/or approvals shall be obtained prior to the operation of the regional pipeline system. The Commission reserves the right to modify, suspend, or revoke this action if the project sponsor fails to obtain or maintain such approvals.

10. The Commission reserves the right to reopen any project docket or issue such additional orders, as may be necessary, to mitigate or avoid adverse impacts or otherwise to protect public health, safety, welfare, or the environment, pursuant to Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.32.

11. Commission approval confers no property rights upon the project sponsor. The securing of all rights necessary and incident to the project sponsor's development and operation of the project shall be the sole and exclusive responsibility of the project sponsor, and this approval shall be subject thereto.

12. This project is approved for inclusion in the Commission's Comprehensive Plan for the Water Resources of the Susquehanna River Basin.

13. In accordance with Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.31(d), if the project is discontinued for such a time and under such circumstances that an abandonment of the project may be reasonably inferred, the Commission may rescind the approval of the project unless a renewal is requested by the project sponsor and approved by the Commission.

14. This modified approval is effective until March 14, 2027, the term of the prior docket approval. As specified in Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.31(e), the project sponsor shall submit an application by September 14, 2026, which will authorize continued operation of this project pursuant to the terms and conditions of this approval until such time as the Commission acts on such application.

Section 5. Special Conditions

15. Additional sources of water, provided they are first approved by the Commission pursuant to Commission Regulations 18 CFR §806.4(a) or §806.22(f)(13), may be added to this approval. The project sponsor shall make such a request, in writing, to the Commission for review and approval by the Executive Director. Any approval issued by the Executive Director shall become effective upon notification to the project sponsor.

16. The project sponsor may request the approved service area of its regional pipeline system be expanded beyond the municipalities listed in Section 2. The project sponsor shall make such a request, in writing, to the Commission for review and approval by the Executive Director. The request shall be accompanied with proof of notice completed in accordance with Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.15(a). Notice should be made directly to the municipalities, counties, and state agencies involved in the service area expansion and in newspaper(s) of general circulation serving the area of the expansion. Any approval issued by the Executive Director shall become effective upon notification to the project sponsor.

17. The project sponsor shall only supply water for use in hydrocarbon development to persons who have properly registered this approval pursuant to Commission Regulation 18 CFR §806.22(f)(12).

18. The project sponsor shall keep daily records, and shall report the same to the Commission upon request, of all persons supplied water from the project for use in hydrocarbon development, including daily quantities supplied. The project sponsor also shall keep daily records, and shall report the same to the Commission upon request, of all persons supplied water from the project for uses other than hydrocarbon development authorized pursuant to Special Condition 19, including daily quantities supplied.

19. Prior to supplying water pursuant to this approval for any use not authorized pursuant to Section 2, the project sponsor shall first submit a request for determination of authorized use to the Executive Director. The project sponsor shall not supply water for such use until authorization is received.

20. The project sponsor shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Commission that all water withdrawn from surface water sources, while under control of or on a facility owned or operated by the project sponsor, is transported, stored, injected into a well, or discharged with appropriate controls and treatment to prevent the spread of aquatic nuisance species.

21. For all sources of water authorized under this approval, the quantity of water the project sponsor may receive from such sources shall be limited to the quantities authorized in the separate Commission approvals issued to such sources.

22. All other conditions in Commission Docket No. 20120604 not inconsistent herewith shall remain effective.
