Dear Mr. Baker:

The Susquehanna River Basin Commission (Commission) received a Request for Reissuance of Approval (Commission Form #86) on April 14, 2022, for seventeen (17) Commission Docket approvals and four (4) Certificates of Registration for Grandfathered Water Use (see Table 1). This request indicated that effective March 28, 2022, SUEZ Water Pennsylvania Inc. had changed its name to Veolia Water Pennsylvania, Inc. (project sponsor). Upon review of the projects and the submitted request for reissuance, it was determined that the request is in compliance with the regulations and consistent with 18 CFR § 806.6(c). Therefore, the approvals listed on Table 1 are hereby reissued effective June 21, 2022.

Associated with the request is Commission Pending No. 2020-036, which is the application for groundwater renewal for the Grantham Operation – Well 2 that is currently under review. As a result of the name change, it is recognized the new project sponsor will take over and continue with the submitted application.

Copies of the approvals listed on Table 1 are available on the Commission's Water Application and Approval Viewer (WAAV) at [www.srbc.net/waav](http://www.srbc.net/waav).

In accordance with the Commission's Regulatory Program Fee Schedule, the Grantham facility is subject to the Annual Compliance and Monitoring fee (ACMF). The Center Square, Dallas, Newberry, and Shavertown facilities continue to be subject to the ACMF. The Bloomsburg, Mechanicsburg, and Harrisburg facilities are currently exempt from the ACMF. The ACMF is contained in the Regulatory Program Fee Schedule, which may be modified over the term of the approvals. The ACMF will be invoiced separately.

Please be advised that, under 18 CFR § 808.11, you have a duty to comply with all provisions of the Susquehanna River Basin Compact (Compact), as well as the Commission's rules, regulations, orders, approvals, conditions of approval, and any other requirements of the Commission. It is your obligation to fulfill all conditions of this approval within the specified time limits and provide written notification to the Commission, as appropriate, and comply with all conditions set forth therein. Failure to meet any term or condition within the specified time may subject you to enforcement action and imposition of civil penalties pursuant to 18 CFR Part 808, Subpart B, and Section 15.17 of the Compact. Penalties range from \$50 to \$1,000 per day, per condition (which includes exceeding approved quantities), with every day being a separate offense.

Pursuant to 18 CFR § 808.2 relating to administrative appeals, any appeal to this action must be made to the Commission within thirty (30) days of receipt of this notice. All appeals must be made in writing on the Commission's Notice of Appeal form and conform to the requirements of 18 CFR § 808.2. Pursuant to 18 CFR § 808.2(i), an appeal made under this section stays the commencement of the ninety (90)-day appeal period to Federal Court contained in Section 3.10(6) of the Compact.

## **SUEZ WATER PENNSYLVANIA INC. – DALLAS OPERATION**

**Groundwater Withdrawal (30-Day Average) of 0.168 mgd from the Schooley Well,  
and Total System Withdrawal Limit (30-Day Average) of 0.737 mgd**

### **Section 1. Approval**

After review of the record, including the technical findings of Susquehanna River Basin Commission (Commission) staff, the Commission has determined that no significant adverse impacts are anticipated by the operation of this project as described and conditioned herein, the project is physically feasible, and does not conflict with or adversely affect the Commission's Comprehensive Plan. Accordingly, the Commission hereby approves the renewal of the project described herein in accordance with the conditions set forth below.

The project sponsor maintains and operates a public water supply system that includes six groundwater wells (Schooley Well, Gephart Well, Country Club Well, Bunn Well, Haddonfield Well, and the Snyder Well), all of which are incorporated into the total system limit. The public water supply system also maintains interconnections with the SUEZ Water Pennsylvania Inc. – Shavertown Operation and the Aqua Pennsylvania, Inc. – Midway Manor System, which are not incorporated into the total system limit. Based on information provided by the project sponsor, no other sources are operated by the project.

The Commission previously approved the withdrawal of 0.288 million gallons per day (mgd) from the Schooley Well under Commission Docket No. 19881103. The project sponsor submitted a groundwater withdrawal renewal application requesting approval to withdraw 0.168 mgd (30-day average) from the Schooley Well. This approval authorizes the use of the Schooley Well at the requested reduced withdrawal rate and decreases the total system limit established under Commission Docket No. 20050301-2 from 0.740 mgd to 0.737 mgd.

Commission staff has coordinated with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) and the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) during review of this project.

### Section 4. Aquifer Testing

The constant-rate aquifer testing required by 18 CFR § 806.12 for groundwater withdrawals was completed with prior Commission approval. A 69-hour, constant-rate aquifer test of the Schooley Well was conducted on May 11 to 14, 2020, pumping at an average rate of 116 gallons per minute (gpm).

Commission staff determined that the withdrawal from the Schooley Well at the requested withdrawal rate should not cause permanent loss of aquifer storage, render competing supplies unreliable, or cause adverse impacts to the water resources of the basin, subject to the conditions set forth below.

### Section 5. Approved Withdrawal Quantities and Limitations

The withdrawal approved hereunder is subject to the quantitative limits and restrictions set forth in the table below.

## Section 7. Grandfathering Determination – Withdrawals

On May 1, 2018, the project sponsor submitted a grandfathered water use registration form under 18 CFR §§ 806.40-45 for the Country Club Well, the Bunn Well, the Haddonfield Well, and the Snyder Well. The Executive Director issued Certificate of Registration No. GF-202101154 on January 26, 2021, pursuant to 18 CFR § 806.44.

## Section 8. Standard Conditions

1. The project sponsor shall comply with all Commission regulations, 18 CFR Parts 801, 806, and 808. This project is subject to the Annual Compliance and Monitoring fee as specified in the Commission's Regulatory Program Fee Schedule, which may be modified over the term of the approval.
2. The project sponsor shall adhere to the metering plan reviewed and approved by Commission staff. Any modifications proposed for the metering plan shall be submitted for review and, if appropriate, approval by Commission staff in accordance with 18 CFR § 806.30. Modifications shall not be made until the project sponsor receives written approval of the amended plan.
3. The project sponsor shall maintain the totalizing meter and other flow and volume measuring devices, accurate to within five (5) percent, so as to provide an accurate record of withdrawals, and certify to the Commission once every five (5) years, or as otherwise requested, the accuracy of all measuring devices and methods to within five (5) percent of actual flow.



4. The project sponsor shall adhere to the groundwater elevation monitoring plan reviewed and approved by Commission staff for the sources listed in Sections 3, 6, and 7. The project sponsor shall maintain and monitor the accuracy of the measuring devices in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications.

5. The project sponsor shall keep daily records of the project's withdrawals and groundwater elevations for the sources listed in Sections 3, 6, and 7, and shall report the data to the Commission quarterly, and as otherwise required, in the form and manner as prescribed by Commission staff. Quarterly monitoring reports shall be submitted online and are due within thirty (30) days after the close of the preceding quarter. Any alternative measuring, monitoring, or accounting procedure, and any modifications proposed for the groundwater elevation monitoring plan, shall be submitted for review and approval by Commission staff in accordance with 18 CFR § 806.30. Modifications shall not be made until the project sponsor receives written approval of the amended plan. All data collected and submitted as required under this approval shall be maintained by the project sponsor for the duration of the approval and all subsequent renewals.

6. The project sponsor or any other person representing the project sponsor shall allow authorized employees or agents of the Commission, without advance notice, at any reasonable time and upon presentation of appropriate credentials, and without delay, to have access to and to inspect all areas where the project is being constructed, operated, or maintained, or otherwise exercise all investigative powers authorized under 18 CFR § 808.12.

7. In accordance with 18 CFR § 806.30(b)(2), the project sponsor shall report violations of any withdrawal limits and any conditions of this approval within five (5) days of such violation or report loss of measuring or recording capabilities required under 18 CFR § 806.30(a)(1) within five (5) days after any such loss.

8. In accordance with 18 CFR § 806.6, if ownership of the project changes or if the project sponsor undergoes a name change, the project sponsor shall submit application for transfer or reissuance of all approvals to the Commission within ninety (90) days of the change in ownership or project sponsor name change.

9. The project sponsor shall comply with the water conservation requirements specified in 18 CFR § 806.25.

10. This approval is conditioned on the project sponsor maintaining legal access to the withdrawal location for the duration of the approval.

11. The project sponsor shall register with the appropriate agency all groundwater sources described herein, as may be required by regulations of the member jurisdiction.

12. If the project sponsor fails to comply with the provisions of the Susquehanna River Basin Compact or any rule, regulation, or order of the Commission, or any term or condition of this docket, the project sponsor is subject to enforcement actions pursuant to 18 CFR Part 808.

13. Commission approval shall not be construed to exempt the project sponsor from obtaining and maintaining all necessary permits and/or approvals required for the project from other federal, state, or local government agencies having jurisdiction over the project. All such permits and/or approvals shall be obtained prior to the withdrawal of water. The Commission may modify, suspend, or revoke this approval if the project sponsor fails to obtain or maintain such permits and/or approvals.

14. The Commission may at any time reopen any project approval or issue such additional orders, as may be necessary, to mitigate or avoid adverse impacts or otherwise to protect public health, safety, welfare, or the environment, pursuant to 18 CFR § 806.32.

15. Commission approval confers no property rights upon the project sponsor. The securing of all rights necessary and incident to the project sponsor's development and operation of the project shall be the sole and exclusive responsibility of the project sponsor, and this approval shall be subject thereto.

16. This project is approved for inclusion in the Commission's Comprehensive Plan for the Water Resources of the Susquehanna River Basin.

17. The project sponsor is required to apply for and obtain approval prior to any increase in withdrawal that would exceed the amounts listed herein.

18. The project sponsor is required to apply for and obtain approval prior to any increase in the total system withdrawal that would exceed the approved total system withdrawal limits listed herein.

19. If the Commission determines that the operation of the project's groundwater withdrawal adversely affects any existing groundwater or surface water withdrawal, the project sponsor shall be required to provide, at its expense, an alternate water supply or other mitigating measure.

## **Section 9. Special Conditions**

20. The project sponsor is required to apply for and obtain approval prior to any increase in withdrawal from grandfathered sources that would exceed the amounts listed in Certificate of Registration No. GF-202101154.

21. In accordance with 18 CFR § 806.4(a)(1)(iv) and § 806.4(a)(2)(v), a change of ownership of the facility or project will forfeit the grandfathered status and subject pre-regulation withdrawals to Commission review and approval.

22. The date of the last meter certification was December 4, 2019; therefore, the next meter certification is due no later than December 4, 2024. Certification of meter accuracy shall be provided to the Commission no less frequent than once every five (5) years from the date of the last certification.



23. The project sponsor shall only supply water for use in hydrocarbon development to persons who have properly registered or received approval pursuant to 18 CFR § 806.22(f), as applicable.

24. The project sponsor shall keep daily records, and shall report the same to the Commission upon request, of all persons supplied water from the project for use in hydrocarbon development, including daily quantities supplied. The project sponsor shall keep records, and shall report the same to the Commission upon request, of all persons supplied water from the project that maintain a permanent connection to the public water supply system. The project sponsor shall also keep daily records, and shall report the same to the Commission upon request, of all persons supplied water from the project that do not maintain a permanent connection to the public water supply system for uses other than hydrocarbon development, including daily quantities supplied.


### Section 10. Term

25. This approval shall be effective April 1, 2021, and shall remain effective until March 31, 2036. As specified in 18 CFR § 806.31(e), if the project sponsor submits an application on or before September 30, 2035, the project sponsor may continue operation of this project pursuant to the terms and conditions of this approval until such time as the Commission acts on such application, or until otherwise notified by the Executive Director.

26. Commission Docket No. 19881103 shall remain effective through March 31, 2021, whereupon it shall expire.
