2.1 Project Facility Description

Facility Name

The name of the project facility is Well 6.

Anticipated Long-Term Owner and Operator

The Municipal Authority of the Township of East Hempfield (MATEH) owns and operates the municipal water supply system supplying East Hempfield Township. MATEH is the anticipated long-term owner and operator of the project facility.

Type of Facility

The facility is a groundwater withdrawal well and additionally includes a chlorine treatment system and transmission pipelines.

Purpose of the Withdrawal

The groundwater withdrawn from Well 6 is used in the MATEH municipal drinking water supply system.

Description of Site Activities

MATEH was founded in 1941 to supply potable water to East Hempfield Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania. The water supply system consists of 92 miles of pipeline, six pumping stations, and six storage tanks which obtain water from nine groundwater wells (Wells 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 11) and one surface spring (Spring S-1). All source water is treated with chlorine and released to the transmission lines and storage tanks. The authority has the ability to obtain additional water, on an emergency basis, from an interconnection with the City of Lancaster Authority.

Requested Quantity of Water

MATEH is requesting a groundwater withdrawal amount of 0.353 million gallons per day (mgd) from Well 6 on a 30-day average basis.

Date Operations Began

Well 6 was installed and tested in March 1986. Operation began with the issuance of the initial PADEP Public Water Supply Permit in December 1986.
