Projected Facility Description

Water District 2 Well 2 is located on Carpenter Road in the Town of Big Flats, NY. This is a ground water withdrawal well that is one of three wells that supply's nearly 7,000 people with municipal water. The Town is requesting an increased withdrawal rate because we are the fastest growing community in Chemung county. Our water system is a combined water system with the other two wells which are pumped simultaneously and if any one of the three wells needs to be taken offline for maintence or repairs the other two will supply the system. This well was granted to pump .590 MGD on May 11, 1995 and our system uses .650 MGD this and the growing rate of our community is the reason for the increased withdrawal average.
