**PROJECT FACILITY DESCRIPTION
BELL AND EVANS WATER SOURCE
PRODUCTION WELL PW-1**

The Project Facility for this water supply project is currently under construction on Chestnut Hill Road in Bethel Township, Lebanon County. The corporate name of the facility will be Bell & Evans Plant 3. The current and assumed long-term owner and operator of this proposed production well is Farmers Pride, Inc. (d/b/a Bell & Evans). The facility will be utilized as a chicken processing plant. Currently, the facility under construction does not have a water supply. The facility will require approximately 1,000,000 gallons of water per day (gpd). As currently planned, this supply would be comprised of purchased water from the Fredericksburg Water Authority (FWA), the use of groundwater, and recycled water. It is anticipated that a water storage capacity of 300,000 gallons will also be implemented at the facility. Water extracted from proposed production well PW-1 will be conveyed to the Project Facility, and treated wastewater from the Project facility will be subsequently discharged to the Little Swatara Creek, through approximately 2.5 miles of piping installed in 2017. The piping traverses southeast through private property (Weaver Farm) and southerly along Union Road, terminating at the former Peters Tract immediately north of Little Swatara Creek.



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
