Shawville Surface Water Withdrawal

Penn Production Group, LLC (PPG) is proposing a water withdrawal along West Branch Susquehanna River near Shawville, PA in Clearfield County. West Branch Susquehanna River is classified as a Warm Water Fishery (WWF) under Chapter 93 of the PA DEP regulations.

This project entails the installation of a temporary submerged intake, two dri-prime pumps, and above ground meters and valves leading to a buried pipe. The pipeline will flow water to above ground storage tanks. Installation of future pipelines to well pads and fresh water tanks will commence as well field development progresses by PPG over the next 5+ years. This water will be used for drilling and hydraulic fracturing for gas.

This application request is for a withdrawal at 3.0 MGD. The withdrawal site is fenced and will be monitored by PPG. Withdrawal operations are proposed to commence in late summer or early fall of 2021.
