Commonwealth Environmental Systems, L.P. Renewal Application Project Description

Wells 1 and 2 are currently used groundwater sources at the Commonwealth Environmental Systems' (CES) landfill. The CES landfill is located in Foster, Frailey and Reilly Townships, Schuylkill County, Pennsylvania. The current Docket (20070304-1) allows for up to 0.150 mgd of total consumptive use, groundwater withdrawals of 0.090 mgd (30-day average) with an instantaneous rate of production of 625 gpm for Well 1, and a groundwater withdrawal of 0.010 mgd (30-day average) with an instantaneous rate of production of 175 gpd. No consumptive water use or withdrawal increases are requested at this time.

CES has been in continuous operation since 1997. PADEP has issued several 10-year operating permit renewals since that time, with the current operating permit expiring January 31, 2027, at which time a permit renewal application will be submitted to PADEP. The original CES docket was approved on March 14, 2007, Docket No. 20070304, and modified at the request of the landfill on June 12, 2008, Docket No. 20070304-1, to its current conditions. Commonwealth Environmental Systems' landfill consumptively uses truck and tire washing, road washing, dust suppression on roads and the stone crushing facility, and non-portal uses in the administration, leachate treatment plant, maintenance garage and guard house buildings.

Both wells are currently metered and water level indicators have been installed in each well. As per the Revised Metering Plan and Flow Meter Calibrations Approval, dated September 23, 2014, effluent from the reverse osmosis leachate treatment system, also utilized for dust suppression and pavement washing, is monitored for consumption by the number of 10,000 gallon water trucks used. Leachate Treatment Plant effluent, when not use for dust control or pavement washing, is conveyed to Middle Creek as per the NPDES permit. The crushing system is not metered but water delivered to the crusher via tanker truck is recorded in the truck log.
